

ADVANCED INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION DIPLOMA (AICE DIPLOMA)

AICE Diploma is awarded in three categories: Distinction, Merit and Pass, to candidates who satisfy certain conditions as stated in the regulations.

Candidates must gain at least seven credits, including the compulsory GCE AS/A Level Global Perspectives & Research, and one from each of the following curriculum groups: Mathematics & Science (Group 1), Languages (Group 2) and Arts & Humanities (Group 3). The total point score is calculated according to the following:

Points for GCE Advanced Level	140	120	100	80	60	40
Points for GCE Advanced Subsidiary Level	-	60	50	40	30	20

The maximum points score which will be awarded is 420.

Candidates scoring 360-420 points will be awarded a Distinction. Candidates scoring 250-359 points will be awarded a Merit. Candidates scoring 140-249 points will be awarded a Pass.

A candidate's individual syllabus grades are reported separately on General Certificate of Education (GCE) certificates as follows:

GCE ADVANCED SUBSIDIARY LEVEL (GCE AS Level) and GCE ADVANCED LEVEL (GCE A Level)

GCE AS Level grades (single credit study) a(a), b(b), c(c), d(d) or e(e) indicate the standard reached, grade a(a) being the highest and grade e(e) the lowest. Performances below the standard of grade e(e) are not reported on certificates. The content and difficulty of a GCE AS Level examination is equivalent to the first half of a corresponding GCE A Level.

GCE A Level grades (double credit study) A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d) or E(e) indicate the standard reached, grade A*(a*) being the highest and grade E(e) the lowest. Performances below the standard of grade E(e) are not reported on certificates.

For private candidates the centre name is not reported on certificates.
